Chief Pilots Corner

Lately there have been several episodes of pilots stretching their weather limits and getting away with it. Congrats on defying mother nature and winning! No really I mean it! You took a chance, had an alternate plan of action in mind and went for it. I only wish that three of my military buddies had the same judgement and skill.

John was an Aircraft Commander of a C-130. He and his crew were on a low level training mission out in Nevada. There were cells topping to FL600 in the area but they had great radar, a good Navigator, and an experienced Co-pilot on board. Their route took them within 10nm of the biggest cell, and they all agreed it would be no problem just a few bumps. Didn't work out too well for them. Hit a massive downdraft while at 1000 AGL, splat!

Tom was a consummate F-4 pilot. He was tooling around in southern Florida when the call came out to RTB (return to base) for thunderstorms in the area. Vectors to final were given and everything was going fine until a microburst hit him from behind. Back seated made it out (ejected) Tom would have too if he didn't stay with the jet to clear some houses. No one saw the microburst coming (no Doppler radar back in the day). Larry was a great C-141 pilot and loved GA flying. Took me up in his 172 when I visited him. While on leave he and his bride went on a trip from San Francisco to Reno. Weather was iffy with boomers approaching, and winds picking up. Well, he beat the thunderstorm in, but the sudden first gust crosswind estimated to be between 25 and 40 KNTS got him. Just a little sideways cartwheel off the side of the runway. Wife made it out, Larry lasted a few days, long enough for me to visit him.

I was a pall bearer or usher at all three funerals.
